WHAT A HOST FAMILY DOES

The team will need somewhere to stay while they are in town for your retreat(s)!

If you are booking a retreat, we ask that you coordinate a team of host families from your school or parish to house the team while they are with you.

A host family is a household that takes in 2 or more same gendered team members from the NET Team while they are in town. Many of these families have shared that this experience has been of benefit to their family. You can rest assured that these low-maintenance, relatable and good role models will be a joy for your families to host.

Please note: If accommodations are proving difficult, the Scheduling Administrator will assist where possible, however, it is the responsibility of the booking party to ensure accommodations for the team.

- Will arrive between 5-6pm (unless the team communicates otherwise)
- Will provide their own transportation, sleeping bag, and pillow
- Communicates their schedule and meal requirements to you
- Take care of themselves (pack their lunches, make their breakfast, help with dishes, etc.)
- Have fun with your family!

- Provides breakfast, bagged lunch, and dinner during the team's stay.
- Provides a place for the missionaries to sleep during their stay. (Missionaries are prepared to sleep on couches and floor spaces if no beds are available)
